Recipes

10. Let it cook for 12 minutes at 300 °F (if you're in a hurry, you can put it for 6 minutes at 600 °F and so on). 11. Taste one of the biscuits. If it's not good, try another one. If the result is the same, throw it all and go to the shop to fetch butter biscuits.

12. You're all set!

* You can make Better Biscuits adding some cinnamon and Bitter Biscuits replacing sugar with orange peel (use with caution).

Obituary

Movie Reviews

Des serpents dans l'avion (1999)

This French film, directed by Kaa Python, is a remake of the 1942 film *Star Wars*, where stars have been replaced with snakes and space with sky.
